This policy pertains to credit recovery courses offered before school, after school, during evening time, on Saturdays, and over the summer. Students may participate in credit recovery during traditional school hours only they have anabbreviated schedule approve by their principaland school counselor and are not enrolled in a traditional course during that time. As a part of DCPS' high school summer school programming, and based on starfailability, credit recovery courses are available to all secondary students who failed an eligible course (see Allowable Course spelow) during any previous school year.

B. Allowable Courses
